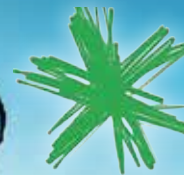

MONSTER TROUT TOURNAMENT 2016

We were lucky this was not another ocean event as the spring squally weather continues to upset fishing plans across the country. This time however we were contained to the inland waters of the Eastern Region with the epi-centre of tournament activity based on Lake Rotoiti.

The Monster Trout event continues to be somewhat of a galvanising event for members that ordinarily spend most of their time sea fishing and it must be said for a bunch of salty sea dogs we really did quite well!

The fishing was again three days with a biggest difference being the Friday fishing fell into the 2015-16 season. This being the case the new season fishing didn't kick off until Saturday, a day that would bring a bit of everything. Wind, rain, sunshine and loads of fish!

Most of the teams managed to get on the waters of Lake Rotoiti before sun up and the skies lightened on October the 1st the well-rested rainbows and brownies turned their attentions to feeding. With repetitive hooting and shouting coming from all directions and most of the waving being done with landing nets, it certainly

was a special morning of trout fishing. Infact I don't know of anyone that didn't catch a fish this opening weekend that was on a boat, and when the average size was well over 2kg that is great fishing anywhere in the world.

53 anglers from our Club (slightly up on the 45 last year) weighed over 100 fish this year and conservatively released 2-3 times this number. Most of these fish were 2-4 year old which is the secret to a put and take fishery well managed by Fish & Game.

Most of the teams fished really hard, and with a few beers on the Saturday night, and yet another early start Sunday, our Prize Giving back at the Club was a rather subdued affair, due to most tanks running on empty! Kilwell's blinged-out prize pool topped up by loads of BNT automotive spot prizes went down a treat. Topped off only by the awesome glass art from Colins photography. Congratulations to all of our contestants and winners, a most enjoyable weekend!

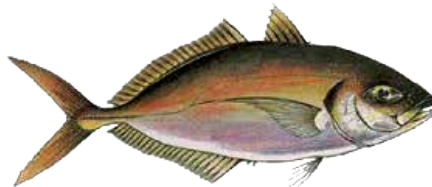

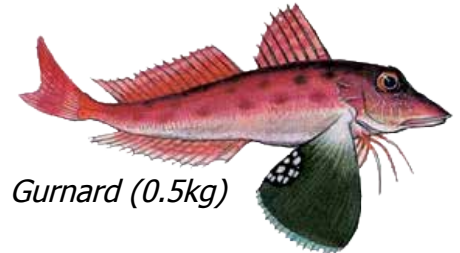

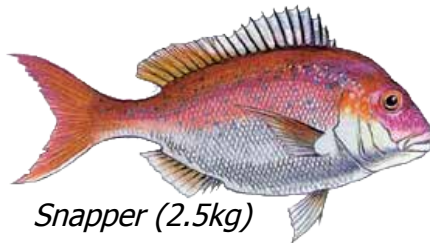

Entry Fee: \$20.00 (Includes Adults & Juniors)

Entry: Entry fee covers the weigh-in of each of the six named species and must be paid no later than the day prior to weigh-in of your first fish. Anglers may only have one fish per ladder at any one time. Bigger fish may replace smaller fish (if caught)

Teams: Anglers may fish this tournament as individuals including fishing from PWCs and kayaks as long as they have communications with Coastguard or a support vessel.

Fishing Area: Fish must be caught within NZ Chart 54 (mod) and must be weighed in at the TSFC. Random access permitted (boats may launch from anywhere)

Rules: Fish must be fresh and caught in accordance with Club, NZSFC and IGFA rules.

Points: Accumulating ladder total. Highest position 10 points descending. Any species can be weighed any month to contribute to anglers final points.

Prizes: Sweepstake and Ian Milburn Trophy, Adults 1st – 3rd. Monthly Bar (\$50) and Salt Kitchen voucher (\$50) for largest nominated species for the month. Should a junior angler win, \$50 Salt Kitchen voucher will replace bar voucher. Sweepstakes paid 70%, 20% and \$10% respectively for 1st-3rd point leaders (across all species)

Final Weight In: 6.00pm Thursday 31 December 2016.

Results: Russell Hardie Angler Leader board will be displayed in the Club Foyer also on the website www.tsfc.co.nz

DECORO SNAPPER KINGFISH TOURNAMENT 2016

The Snapper Kingfish Tournament this year received a major overhaul with long time sponsor Decoro coming on board and the event receiving new categories most notably the epic prizes that adorned the Measure and Release Snapper and Kingfish sections.

Measure and Release events are not a new thing for the Tauranga Sport Fishing Club with both the Decoro Softbait Masters and the Jigging & Casting Tournament were for years both hosted events at the Club. Softbaiting, jigging and casting techniques exploded on the fishing scene around eight years ago now and gave rise to each of these events and the subsequent trophies and after interest started to wane (as it does) these events were flagged away sadly.

So the plan was to dust these two local iconic trophies off and have them re-badged and awarded them to deserving anglers in this year's event. Along with this Earl Bond of ENL Electronics called up back in July and enquired if we would consider being a contender event for the Furuno Snapper World Cup (just the most iconic Snapper trophy in NZ!) Needless to say we jumped at the opportunity and before too long we had all three trophies lined up, surrounded by plenty of Accurate Reel booty, and it really didn't take long to see the fisho's circling like magpies and signing up for the opportunity to win.

The new structure threw in the interesting dynamic of "how big a snapper was big enough to enter in the World Cup contender section?" after all most of the best prizes were in Measure and Release. The smallest Snapper to ever win the Snapper World Cup was a little over 8kg, which is well achievable from the Bay, so hopes were high for a solid TSFC result.

We made the call on the weather on the Thursday prior to the event briefing so our travelling anglers had plenty of time to get sorted for fishing. The weather had looked, at that point, to be fluctuating between 14-20 knots so not ideal, but not bad enough to postpone the tournament. That was the best we were to see the forecasting get. From here on every four hours the updates progressively got worse. By briefing the forecast was touching 24knots, in fact hindsight being a great thing I would have preferred to have the boats home as the winds on Saturday night easily exceeded 30knots. Not ideal didn't sum it up, 'total crap' being closer to the truth for those overnighting. With Coastguard well informed and sensible boating decisions keeping everyone on the water safe, many of the keen anglers actually fished well into the night which was a commendable effort requiring plenty of guts and an equal amount of loopiness!

So in the end 84 anglers braved the blustery conditions mostly from the relative shelter of either the harbour or offshore islands that offered some cover (Mayor, Karewa, Plate, Motiti) some of the more adventurous even hitting Culvier Island!

The King Hit team reported Cape Runaway was unfishable on Sunday, but had fortunately fished pretty well on the Saturday, so the tournament was all about grabbing the opportunities available to each team. These guys were targeting Kingfish as were a few other teams, and interestingly no Kingies were killed for the event rather released so the anglers could compete for the better measure and release prizes.

Fishing was overall regarded as a bit tough and not helped by the wind, in saying this most boats had respectable catches of good 35-45cm snapper to take home. The bait and berley efforts at Mayor and Motiti produced the best fish over the weekend, the biggest a 79cm beast snapper for Tony Woods of Aquatek Charters.

Congratulations to Charlie Champness off King Hit who managed the longest Kingfish and taking out the Dave Foley Memorial Trophy.



Josh Hough also did well claiming the Heaviest Snapper, and he is now the leading contender for the Furuno Snapper World Cup, and well done to the Fixation team for taking out the Decoro Champion Team Trophy with the longest combined length for a Snapper and Kingfish. 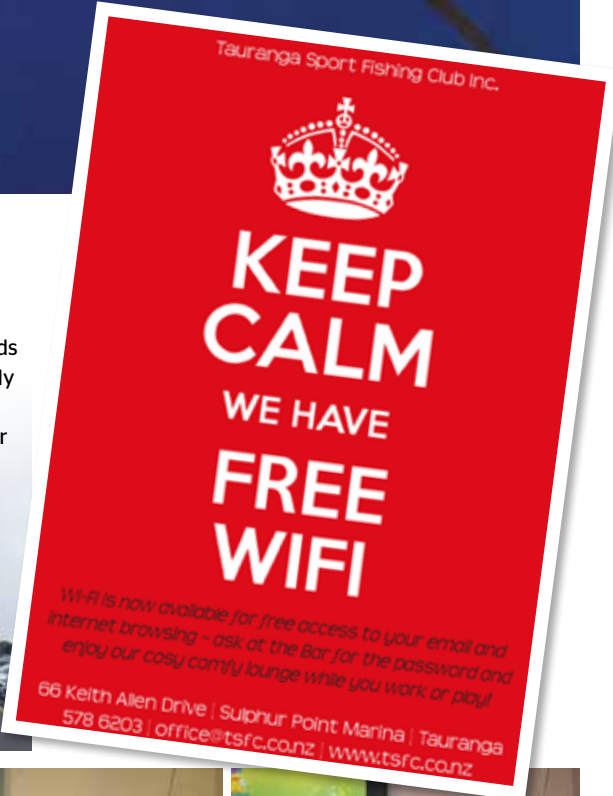

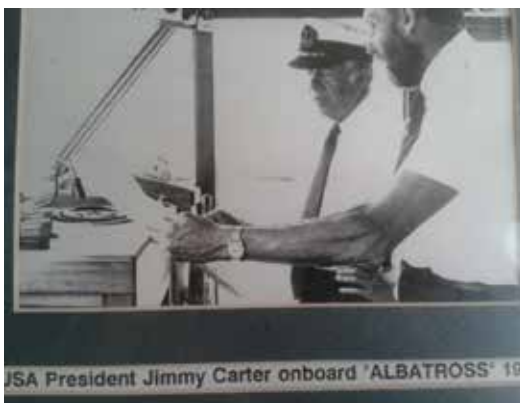

PUBLIC SAYS MINISTRY NEED TO UP THEIR GAME

A recent survey shows that 83% of New Zealanders feel that the current approach to fisheries management is average to very poor when it comes to limiting catch and rebuilding our fish stocks to a suitable level.

LegaSea is surprised by the depth of dissatisfaction amongst the general public to the way our fisheries are being managed by the Ministry for Primary Industries.

The independent survey conducted in early October included a series of questions about the Ministry's performance when it comes to limiting industrial fishing inshore, fairly allocating catch between sectors, reducing both the bycatch of protected species and the wastage associated with dumping unwanted catch.

Over 1900 people completed the survey, offering new insights into the disappointment felt by the public around our current Quota Management System (QMS).

This negative reaction is no doubt a response, in part, to the recent report by Dr Glenn Simmons revealing widespread illegal fish dumping and the Ministry for Primary Industries' decisions not to prosecute in several cases.

On the back of comprehensive media coverage of the damning report there was an interesting response to the question "Do you think an independent inquiry into fisheries management and the Quota Management System is needed?"

Over 70% of respondents share LegaSea's frustrations and agreed that it was indeed time for a review. Around 26% of people were unsure and only 4% thought a review was unnecessary.

PARTY VOTE

Of most interest to our decision makers will be the

breakdown of support by party vote.

Support for an independent review of the QMS was mixed, with United Future voters the least keen on a review, and ACT and Mana supporters polling highest. Overall there was more than 70% support for an independent review.

Seventy percent of people also said 'yes' when asked if people taking marine fish and other public natural resources for profit ought to pay a resource rental.

When broken down by party support, 69% of National Party voters supported a resource rental. Green and Labour Party supporters were almost inseparable, at 74% support for this resource tax.

People clearly see the need for a tax to be applied to those exploiting public resources for private gain.

PEOPLE WANT ACTION NOW

This survey shows the public are calling for and expecting action. MPI have ignored this issue for too long and only an independent review can restore public faith in the Ministry to protect our precious marine environment, to enforce fisheries regulations, and reduce waste.

As long as this system remains unchecked, it is the public and our future generations that will suffer.

We risk losing a healthy productive marine environment with abundant fish stocks, which is such a big part of our kiwi lifestyle.

Currently, this amazing natural resource is being taken from us by an uncaring industry and seemingly nonchalant Ministry, with only the large corporates at the end of the line making any real profit.

LegaSea won't idly stand by and watch our fish being thrown away for nothing, we are standing up and calling for a review. The public clearly expect the Ministry to up their game.

Let's all band together to fix our fisheries so we never lose that essential part of all of our lives.
