



And on a end note, Tasmania has seen a recent run of large Broadbill Swordfish, so fingers crossed we get to see a good finish to our season - there has to be one go the magic 300 over our scales soon.

2017 HIREPOOL TRAILER BOAT TOURNAMENT REPORT

The build-up to this year's event was fantastic with plenty of promotion over the airways, posters everywhere and our team of flyer droppers working hard to cover the bustling boat ramps on both sides of the harbour. Certainly the boat ramps from Boxing Day on are something to behold with any given sunny day seeing the ramp traffic swelling to 300 plus trailers just at the Sulphur Point ramp. We sure do like our fishing over this period and this is why the timing of the Trailer Boat tournament is spot on!

Weather is always a factor and this year we were blessed (unlike last year!) with a fishable forecast that over-delivered with mostly clear skies and light winds. Our weather for the entire event pretty well bucked the strong westerly trend that has defined the start of summer, so it was nice to get lucky this time.

By the end of briefing we had 110 anglers signed up, this being well up on last year, and not surprising we caught more fish! With a good showing of solid albacore to 12kg, and we had some quality entries in the wreck fish and measure and release Snapper and Kingfish categories see fish caught in all categories, just not Billfish! See

This year the Club was privileged to have not only Scott Parry from the TV show Fishing & Adventure on board but also all of the shows sponsors! The shows Surtees aptly named 'Holy Ship' was also to fish the event kindly taking Stu from Okuma and Jack from Hirepool with the lads fishing hard and doing particularly well on the snapper and finding a patch of trevally that for whatever reason were tough to catch this weekend anywhere else.

With the 'random access' rule in place the trailer boats were welcome to venture throughout Chart 54. Some of the teams choose the more northern waters of the Aldermans, and a couple of boats shot through to White Island and over-nighted.

Miss B Haven was the only boat to come close to threatening the marlin prizes after playing a billfish for 20mins only to have the hooks pull! Bugger! Other than this the pelagic offshore action was restricted to Albacore and a few skipjack that have yet to arrive.

Brian Grey on Robot had a spectacular first day pulling a couple of puka and a nice measure and release kingle that took out two first places in these sections and did it solo! The Wally of the Weekend was contested by a couple of good yarns but taken out by our own Club Captain managing to hit a shark at 25knots on the way home...this did nothing for the health of the outboard.

It was awesome to see the dozen junior's anglers fishing hard and catching some nice fish, with Josh Leigh off 'Wind Her UP' pipping the rest of the field with a lovely 9.44kg Albacore Tuna. The Raymarine Hero Shot was hotly contested with Helen Eynon off Elevar receiving the Dragonfly sounder, a great pic and a deserving winner as judged by Scott from Fishing & Adventure...I reckon the F&A singlet helped her out!



Just prior to the Thursday night briefing the weather eased with the Gale Force warning being dropped and it became clear that the days ahead were going to be better than the original forecast. So although it was a little bit sloppy for the Friday morning, the girls could look forward to much calmer seas over the days ahead.

As always, there is always a good deal of marlin and tuna fever around, although this season is proving harder than the last two to catch one of these elusive beasts. Offshore water conditions, despite being blue and 20 degrees plus just seem to be devoid of the usual bait schools. It could be the season is just 6 weeks late, regardless the offshore fishing was tough this year.

Lucky the Fish N Chicks fish schedule comprises many more species than just the hard to get pelagics. With terakihi, snapper, and kingfish on the list it gives the ladies the option of hugging the islands or the inshore and having a great crack at winning some prizes. Somehow after doing the hard yards offshore a spot of line fishing can be more relaxing and enjoyable, two qualities most teams in this event look for in the 'perfect day fishing'.

Three good Kingies came across the weigh station scales, the best of them being a 24.32kg model to Michelle Clark on board Wai Whare Charters, followed by a nice 17.88kg fish for Anita Syben on Apteryx, these out of G Fab Trailers and High Duty Plastics.

Some quality snapper were also caught, the best of them a 7.665kg model to Tracey Holmes on board Sterling Belle. Second place in the snapper went to Rhoda Phillip 5.87kg, and backed up by her team mate Kylie Silby 4.52kg both on board the boat Bliss.

The offshore efforts were not completely without reward with Cobar II striking first, landing a stripey on the inside of Mayor in the green water! Unfortunately this fish came up tail wrapped and could not be revived. Although the fish didn't quite make qualifying weight; at 84.3kg it was a massive buzz for the team and Kelly Whiffen who made the trip over from Australia. Not wanting to miss out, Emma Keyworth on Jans Decision managed a tag and release a Striped Marlin as did Anita Syben again on Apteryx who seemed to be enjoying an action packed tournament!

Giving up on the offshore quest the team on Free Flo decided to hit Mayor in the hope of hitting pay dirt on the Tarakihi. They did just that, managing a first and second place fish for Many Kupenga and sponsor Jodie Gollop with a 1.885 and 1.72kg respectively from Champness Roofing. Congratulations ladies!

This was the second year the HERO SHOT was run with the support of Tauranga SPARK BUSINESS HUB offering an Iphone 7 as incentive to get the best Fish N Chick on the water photo. We were flooded with entries and these can all be found on our Facebook site and our website tsfc.co.nz. Mandy Kupenga, our HERO SHOT judge had her work cut out in sorting out the three top places but finally got there naming Kelly Whiffen's on-board marlin shot number one, young Jovanna Pillay took out second with a very nice snapper perfectly positioned in great light, and in third was Tracey Holmes with her outstanding Mayor

Island snapper. We had some great shots with a good deal of creativity in all of the entries so congratulations to everyone that got involved!

Prize giving was outstanding with all of the fancy dress teams going to extreme measures to impress. Supported by the Radical Kids Band the "Quick fire runaway" was a hit giving piles of laughs along the way. Well done to the Xarisma - 1st, SunKist - 2nd and Ultimate Brandys finishing strongly in third!

ALL ABOUT CONSTRUCTION GAME ON TOURNAMENT

The postponement on the 22-24th January turned out to be absolutely the right call as the weather that folded over the Bay of Plenty that weekend was truly awful. The postponed Sunday delivered 5 metre seas and 43 knots of Northerly that was hoped to drive in the warmer water that had been held off for weeks by the strong south westerlies.

Fast forward a week and the forecasted stationary High did its best to deliver on the promise of good weather for our new dates but fell short with winds offshore touching 20knots early Saturday morning and leaving many tucked in behind Mayor enjoying a longer than usual breakfast. By midday the winds eased right up and the good weather rolled in letting all boats explore far and wide.

This year's GAME ON attracted 119 anglers, slightly down on last year. It looked like we lost a few teams to long weekend commitments, which just made the odds better for those that showed. Fantastic prizes from Shimano and Maui Ocean Products adorned the stage and with \$10000 in cash pooled in the Calcutta it was Game On for anniversary weekend!

Andros, Sunkist, Jans Decision and Brothers in Arms all experienced the misfortune of dropping marlin that were desperately needed for the Calcutta Billfish points. Instead Aaron Layne who was fishing solo on Ocean Warrior managed a large 30.6kg Shortbilled Spearfish early on Sunday morning, this qualifying in the Billfish category for the Calcutta. The Hoggs aboard Aquarius seem to have the midas touch running over a big school of yellowfin tuna hooking and landing four!

Eventually no marlin would stick, so it was to be that the Ocean Warrior Spearfish would take out first place in the Calcutta. By default with no other billfish on the catch sheet the remaining places were to be determined by the next heaviest fish (between tuna and mahimahi). This was to be Brent Hoggs 23.9kg Yellowfin Tuna landing Team Aquarius second place. The next heaviest qualifying fish (over 10kg's) was to come off Jans Decision, a nice 11.74kg Albacore netting the guys 3rd prize.

A1 HOMES TSFC ONE BASE 2017

A stationary high pressure system hovered over New Zealand like some sort of mirage. Surely not! It's One Base time! You know this is the one where we usually head out for four days with at least half of the time looking like the perfect storm, but not this year! This year the weather gods said "no more with wind or wild seas." Instead they said "we will give you 3 glorious days on the water, and just to remind you it is a One Base, a puff of wind on the 4th day."

Sounding a bit like some sort of religious experience (and some may argue a One Base is!) the tournament kicked off on Thursday 1st March with half of the field lining up in the harbour entrance for a 7.30am start. As the clock ticked down the cloud of diesel smoke rose as the fast boats rose to the plane. Turbo's whirred and the entrance was turned momentarily into a swirling jacuzzi. Strap down the coffee cups said the skippers in the 8 knot boats, quietly making the resolution to start further back next year!

There is something very cool about seeing our boats getting safely away packed full of fuel, food and anticipation for the adventure and fishing ahead. From the Mount entrance we saw the boats disappear from sight, fanning out over the big glassy paddock and into the depths of chart 54. The choices were stay local, head north or head east. Many boats did head north to scout the often productive waters off the Mercury Islands. While others pushed east to the East Cape with fingers crossed this year the big blue marlin fishery will again fire, as the timing seemed perfect for this to happen. The stage was well and truly set with Deryk and Kezza manning Game Base and with most of the boats on the water, the early hours on Thursday just became a waiting game as the boats looked to get on the fish.

The action didn't take long to come with Erice Marie hooking up at 9.46am and after only 37minutes they had a super lively Stripey at the boat. The crew had their hands full and were unable to get a photo, so this one did not qualify as the first fish. Double strike called in at 9.54 with a billfish on only to lose it 10 minutes later. Two lots of early disappointment came right with Savanna City hooking up at 10.55am and 25 minutes the skipper reporting a tagged striped marlin. This thanks to Bay Insurance Brokers guaranteed the angler a Shimano Tiagra 50W. Day one progressed with 32 hook-ups and two other tag and release marlin to Island Girl and Silver Crest. The first day highlight was offered up by Lawrence and Jonathan Flude on board Gulfseeker hooking the dream fish at 2.20pm and only taking an hour to boat it. The next day this Blue Marlin pulled the scales down to 225.8kg and was to be the only weighed billfish in the Blue/Black/Sword category earning Gulfseeker the prestigious Champion Boat title and Mt Smart Marine Trophy for the heaviest fish in the One Base for 2017!

Three days to go and with so much action happening over the first day, hopes were high for more good fishing, clear skies and calm seas. This year the fish didn't appear to be holding in any one area making getting any sort of billfish bite somewhat of a lottery, much to the frustration of many of the usually high performing boats. Day two saw another 31 hook-ups and saw Fin-Finder losing a Blue at the boat after 5 hours! As the day went on a total of nine marlin were hooked, of which six were dropped! The days landed Striped Marlin went to Tidal Light and Ultimate Brandy's both these fish coming out of our most northern grids. The team on Courageous was not to be out done though tagging and releasing a lovely stripey estimated at 120kg, this one out of Orange Corporation grid.

As the sun came up on day three everyone was counting their lucky stars (literally!) as the weather was holding beautifully. The first proper bite wasn't until midday with the radio silence broken by Bacchus with a double hook-up of Striped Marlin which were landed and boated. Shortly after, AAron Paku on Cobarll landed what was to be the heaviest stripey for the tournament at 116.8kg. Junior Draydon Layne continued his good season with his Dad reporting in a nice Albacore and Mahimahi for Ocean Warrior. Well done to Kairos, Aspire, Magnum, Eagle Rock and Prowler for tagging and releasing marlin too! The weigh station certainly had a much busier day with Spearfish, Mahimahi, Squid, Striped Marlin and the first of the measure and release snapper and kingfish entries started to filter through. All in all there were 46 hook-ups on day three with 5 T&R marlin, 5 marlin landed, 1 s/b spearfish, 8 mahimahi and yes more squid! Highlights from the day had to be from Bacchus and their extraordinary ability to attract the hookup as after they weighed their double marlin effort they returned out and almost immediately reported another double hook-up, this time both falling off!

The final day served up some fresh westerlies and the last opportunity for our teams to find fish in time to make weigh station at 3pm. Most of the boats that travelled afar need most of this time just to get home while the local boats kept fishing. The day saw 24 hook ups which consisted of a couple of dropped marlin, a landed yellowfin, kingies and a spearfish. All in all 133 hook-ups over the four days and judging by all of the brown faces with sunny marks its looked like the time on the water for most was super enjoyable! It has been pleasing to see so many entries in the measure and release sections and going forwards I know the Club is keen to grow these categories so well done to those anglers getting in behind this initiative.

One final note is saved for our sponsors who support us so well, with special thanks to A1 Homes, Bay Insurance Brokers, Port of Tauranga and Shimano NZ and lastly to our anglers who come to fish enjoy themselves and it's this spirit that has made the event so popular. We look forward to seeing you all back next year!



NZSFC ITM/SIMRAD **NATIONALS 2017**

Another year, totally different fishing season.

Indifferent weather through summer meant that very few fish had been seen, particulary down the East Coast of the North Island and into our chart area. In the previous two seasons the lead up to the Nationals had showed good early season fishing right down into our zone. Not this year.

And so, a number of our 21 teams and 76 anglers headed north to fish out from Whangaroa, and up to the Three Kings, with high expectations that things would be better up that way. Whilst Noelani, Bandit, the Weapon, Black Label, Men at Work and others all headed right up north, Doug Stewart and his team on Ocean Monarch headed to the outer reaches of Chart 54, fishing out from Mercury Bay with high hopes in one of their favourite fishing areas. Bear in mind that both Louise and Brian had featured in last year's tournament. And a couple of teams headed out east to the Cape in the hope that the warm water might finally arrive and it was more likely to happen there first.

But the previous seasons plentiful fishing wasn't to be this year, with the marlin & tuna being nowhere near as plentiful as they have been. Yes there were fish, and in the end there were reasonable numbers caught or tagged. But not in the quantities of the previous two years.

Early on, the signs were good with fish being seen and caught. Bandit, who had gone north earlier had already done well and Tania had a marlin put a tattoo down the side of the boat in a lead up tournament, and then on the first day Mitch Tombleson put a Blue in the boot, weighing in at 180kg, Alan tagged a couple of Mako sharks. Jack Williams on The Weapon also recorded a Blue at 209 kg, Jonathon Hill on Kyrenia tagged a Blue, Cory Davies on Black Label and Vaughan Craven on Satori also tagged Stripey's. Tauranga club were well and truly on the board and away to a great start.

On the 19th word came through that Brian Stanbridge on Ocean Monarch had tagged a marlin and by the 20th both Alan Spiers and Justin Tombleson had tagged Stripeys added to the list for Bandit and Graham Smith for team Stray Cats had a Stripey on the scales at Waihau Bay. Alan Rowe, a visitor fishing on Reality also weighed a Striped Marlin at 116kg

By that stage word had also come through Donna Pascoe had landed a massive 420.4kg Blue Marlin for Houhora which was to lead the tournament right through. There was some discussion around the teams up north about this fish, and the condition of the trace presented to the weigh station. The fact was that it had been accepted by the weigh master up there and it wasn't queried any further at the time.

The 22nd also saw a Striped Marlin to Campbell Carter on The Weapon, a Mako and a Striped Marlin Brett D'Orr on Noelani, a Striped Marlin to Alan Davis on Satori, and to Richard Peddie on Stray Cats, all tagged. On top of that Grant Curtis added a Short Billed Spearfish weighing 19.2kg down at Waihau.

The rest of the tournament saw things quieten off a bit, with the weather up north not that favourable apparently. None the less we were still recording points with a tagged Blue Marlin to Don Simich on The Weapon on the 24th, another Striped Marlin to Brett D'Orr on the 23rd, and a Blue Marlin to Haydon Emsley on the 24th, both on Noelani. Mike Cameron on Satori recorded a tagged Striped Marlin, Vaughan Craven on the same boat tagged a Blue Marlin, Campbell Mills on Kyrenia tagged a Striped Marlin. Jonno Bell fishing with Aidan and Tony Brown put In Pursuit on the board with a tagged

Striped marlin, And Barry Jensen on Reality had his 2nd marlin in two seasons on Reality, tagged. Maurice Chamberlain on Stray Cats kept their tally ticking over with a tagged Stripey. Kim Curtis on Ocean Pacific also tagged a very nice Striped marlin.

There were a couple of our boats up north who had not recorded anything and Black Label had only the one tagged fish, unusually quiet for them. Men at Work had thought their luck was going to be in when Mickey Lee picked up a lucky angler draw on the 2nd day, a hand held VHF and then Luke Dolman picked up a Simrad electronics package on day 4. Then things went quiet!

Until the 2nd to last day, when news came through that Luke Dolman had hooked up and was on a good Blue. 9 hours later, on stand-up, Luke put a good fish in the boat. This was a truly remarkable effort on his part and drew the admiration of the rest of the crew, who all acknowledged that he was the best man for the job. All the more remarkable because the fish had died and the last two hours were spent patiently working it up to the boat

The decision was made and they started their run back to Tauranga to weigh it. A stop on the way to refuel saw them back in Tauranga mid Saturday afternoon and a very healthy crowd at the weigh station to greet them. At 318kg the fish accumulated 859 points for the boat and the club, and put Luke into 2nd place in the category, behind the Donna Pascoe fish. A great effort Luke, congratulations from all of us.

And so the 2017 Simrad/ITM nationals came to an end with Tauranga finishing 6th overall in the Varta Cup

Our four top teams all finished within 38 points of each other, 1st Team Bandit, 2nd Stray Cats, 3rd the Weapon and 4th Noelani. Top effort by all who competed, and great to see a few new teams fishing in the country's top tournament.

CLUB NIGHT THURSDAY





LATEST NEWS FROM LEGASEA

A CHANCE TO REMOVE TRAWLING FROM THE HAURAKI GUI F

A new initiative to restore abundance and diversity in the Hauraki Gulf Marine Park was presented in early December. The Sea Change Tai Timu Tai Pari, Marine Spatial Plan is the result of three years of collaboration by a wide range of stakeholders from within the Marine Park.

This bold new plan proposes the complete removal of outdated, destructive fishing methods, such as bottom trawling, Danish seining and dredging. This is a significant victory and would be a major step towards rebuilding abundance inside one of New Zealand's favourite fishing areas.

The removal of these bottom contact methods would allow the fragile seabed communities to recover, providing more suitable habitats and food sources for all species. This would mean abundance would be spread across the whole Marine Park, not just restricted to your favourite Spot X anymore. The commercial representatives requested some time to action such a big move, so starting next year the Plan would incrementally remove bottom contact fishing methods. By 2025 these would be out of the Marine Park altogether.

There will be full reviews to address the declining hāpuku and crayfish stocks with management measures to rebuild populations back to acceptable levels.

The Plan also takes a look at other methods to protect sensitive habitats, implement

environmentally responsible aquaculture, reduce sedimentation, and improve water quality. The proposals include a range of new Marine Protected Areas in popular fishing areas, there are four types proposed.

Type 1 marine reserves

Type 2 benthic protection areas - these restrict fishing methods impacting the seabed Special Management Areas - These are areas with specific focus on high-value recreational fishing with targeting management restricting the harvest of certain species and all commercial fishing Ahu Moana - are proposed to extend from high tide mark to one kilometre offshore, to allow specific management decisions to be made by mana whenua and local communities around their vulnerable intertidal zones.

The Sea Change plan is an incredible opportunity to create a Marine Park that will be able to provide for the public and create something future generations can enjoy. The New Zealand Sport Fishing Council clubs and affiliated members are encouraged to support the Plan because of the potential growth in fish abundance and marine diversity.

There will be pressures to pick and choose the favourite parts of the Plan, but to do so would risk the complete unravelling of so much valuable work. To achieve a goal as bold as restoring abundance and protecting sensitive habitats, there will be short-term costs. But given time, these sacrifices will pay off and for the first time in many years we will see a dramatic change for the good in the Hauraki Gulf

Spiced Tarakihi with Quinoa & Coconut Yoghurt

Tarakihi

Serves 4

4 Fillets Tarakihi

1/2 tsp. each Garlic & Ginger crushed

½ tsp. Turmeric

Chilli to taste

1 Tbsp. Fresh coriander

1 Tbsp. Fish sauce

1 tsp. Sesame oil

2 Tbsp. cooking oil

METHOD:Mix together all ingredients to make a paste to rub over fish, allow to sit for 20 minutes covered in fridge.

Quinoa

1 cup Quinoa white

2 cups Seafood or vegetable stock

1/2 tsp Salt

METHOD: Place Quinoa in a pot along with stock and salt, bring to boil reduce heat and simmer covered with a lid for 12 minutes until stock is absorbed. In the meantime cook the tempering recipe below to mix through the warm Quinoa.

1/2 Red onion sliced

25g butter

25ml olive oil

2 Tbsp. Cumin seed

1 clove crushed garlic

200g chopped fresh tomato ½ tsp cumin powder

2 tbsp. chopped coriander

METHOD: Heat oil and butter in a thick bottomed frying pan or pot, add sliced onions and cumin seeds cook until golden brown stirring when required. Add garlic and cook 3 minutes then add chopped tomatoes. Cook on steady simmer until oil separates from tomatoes about 5 to 10 minutes. Toss in coriander and cumin powder then pour into Quinoa and mix through leaving it nice and fluffy.

Yoghurt Dressing

200g Coconut yoghurt

2 Tbsp. Lime juice

1 Tbsp. each Chopped coriander & mint

METHOD: Cook seasoned fish fillets in pan with plenty of oil on a medium heat approx. 4 minutes each side until just cooked, serve with spiced Quinoa and top with coconut yoghurt. Accompany with a fresh salad or stir fried vegetables for a quick and very tasty meal with a difference.
