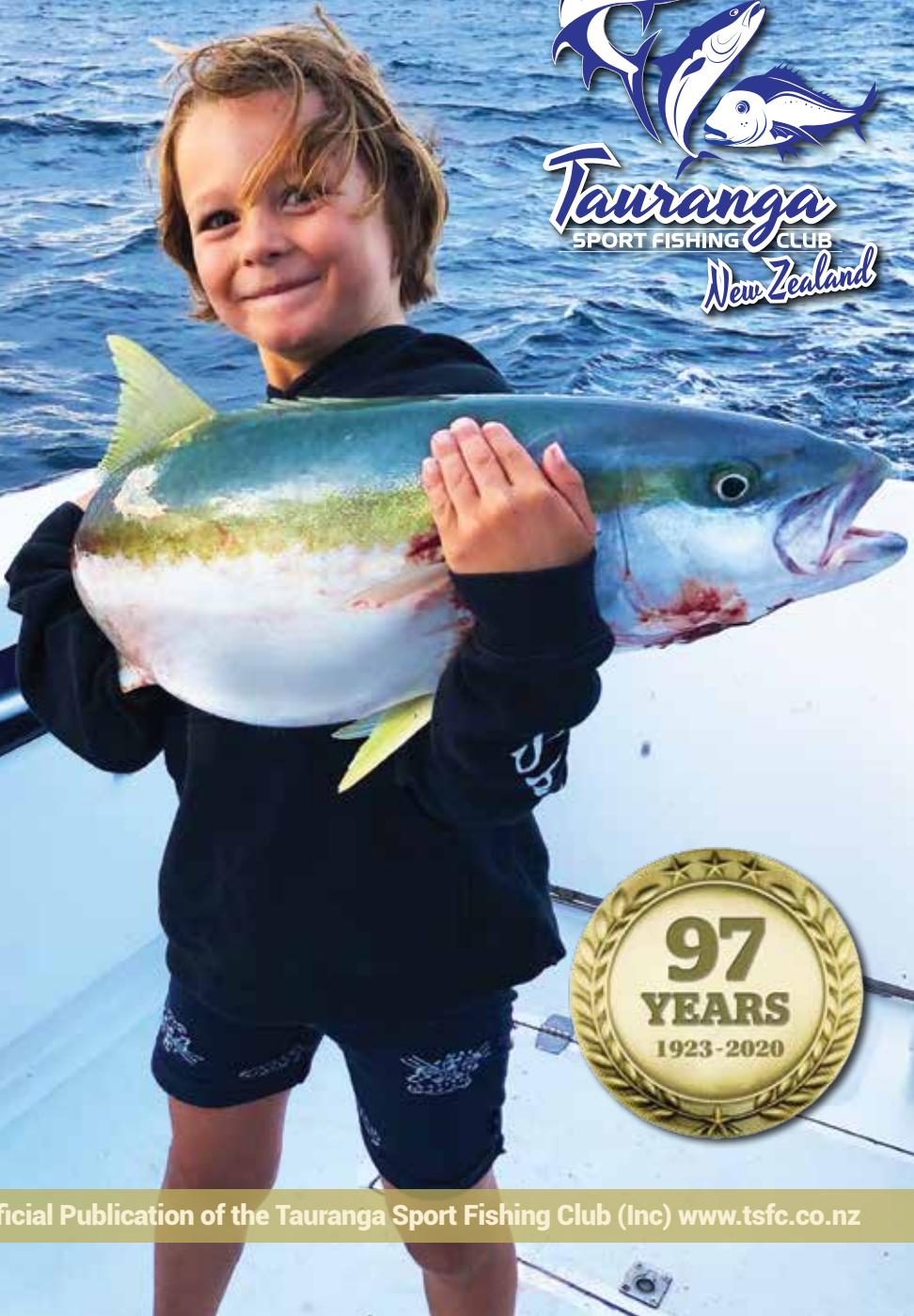

Hello my name is Doug Stewart

Clearly, we are all passionate about our club and want to ensure the club's ongoing, sustainable financial position and future.

Nearly 5 months ago - I was asked by the advisory and the club committee to take on the role as interim president.

Deryk as you will know, was the Club President, and given his ever-increasing workload and then with Covid 19 hitting us, Deryk needed to step back a little. So, on the 7th of April, a few weeks after Covid lockdown announcement I took over the role as president and Deryk took on the vice president role.

My immediate focus was on what actions needed to be taken to stop the continuation of financial losses, the club's financial position was very serious. There had been good progress made on contracting out the restaurant and this has been working well.

But the club still faced high administrative costs and were not making enough profit to cover the overheads. We were totally reliant on sponsor's generosity to survive. Clearly, no business, and the club is a business can survive only on sponsorships alone.

We worked through a consultative process involving the staff, advisory and committee. The huge level of uncertainty around Covid made doing most things far more difficult. Clearly though, we could see Covid would have a substantial impact on how the club could operate and what it would mean financially. We had to make some extremely difficult decisions, including laying staff off. This is never pleasant, but had to be done. To complicate and compound things more we had to do this during Covid level 3 and 4.

What I can tell you is the advisory and committee all came together and have



worked exceptionally well together. We worked on a plan lead by myself to use the down time due to Covid to the club's best advantage.

I am very pleased to say and I don't think I need to tell you what we achieved, you can see first-hand for yourself. The club has had a significant upgrade and make over. I want to add not one single cent of club funds have been used to achieve this. Fully carpeted, extensive internal repaint, new lighting, new design work, new interior upgrade, exterior decks repainted.

All made possible by very generous club sponsors and a number of committed volunteers. I cannot thank all these people enough, another demonstration of the loyalty and commitment to our club.

Before moving on from financial matters I am pleased to tell you that the funds, that were needed from the club's term deposit investment to pay outstanding creditors and

administration expenses, has been repaid and reinvested. We believe these funds should primarily be used for betterment of the club facilities, not used to prop up or cover operating losses.

The committee and I, with Roly our manager, are working on shaping the future of the club, without losing the club's primary focus, being a fishing club.

We are working together on initiatives that will have the club providing more of a family friendly environment and having activities for all ages, including promoting the club as a great place to hold events and functions.

As a starting point today, we the committee, will be asking you to support and vote on a updated constitution for the club. This will provide the base to achieve our plans.

Before I finish, I would like to thank all the committee for their support and effort and I want to particularly thank Deryk. Deryk has and continues to be highly committed to the club and the New Zealand Sport Fishing Council. Thank you Deryk for agreeing to continue on with representing our club within the NZSFC.

I would also like to thank the advisory committee, Ian Thomas (patron), who will be staying on as our patron, Tony Kinzett who is standing for election on the committee, Bill Cavanagh, and Kevin Stephens. Thank you to each of you for your time and contribution to our club. Thank you.

The past 12 months have been like nothing we as a club, community or country has ever experienced. Covid 19 has been a major change catalyst for the Club, needing to adapt, restructure and remodel how the Club will survive and stay relevant in the uncertain times ahead.

As reported last year the Club was struggling with an underperforming restaurant, so it was a welcome relief when we relinquished this space and were very fortunate to have found Brendon and Karolina Donaldson who now lease the restaurant from the Club. We have been thrilled with the progress they have made and the professionalism they bring to this space. From my side it has had the effect of streamlining our admin operation and quite simply it has been refreshing to be working with such pro-active operators. A recent example of this was Karolina's Pink Ribbon breakfast and numerous functions where they continue to over deliver. Together we have many more events planned so watch this space.

Summer for the most part went well for the Club and we were fortunate to get many events in before the Covid 19 lockdown in late March. Every event we ran was profitable and the bar performed well (based on 10 months) and we were able to screw down expenses a little, but still not enough so the bar carries the whole club. Gaming proceeds this year took a downward turn after a strong year last year resulting in the Committee deciding to surrender the gaming licence.

This year especially we have had so much support from our sponsors with well supported events, the Sponsors grid, the Table Leaner promotion and incredible support with the level three lockdown renovation. Our valued sponsor list is too long to go through fairly but you'll see these

I'd like to talk briefly about the Committee. The challenges over the past few years have only ramped up and this group of unpaid individuals have had to do some really heavy lifting over summer and especially over the last 6 months. Digging in with decision making on a wide range of matters, Zooming in remotely when we were in lockdown, this group lost no momentum and then when we could finally leave home most were down here working committed to a vision when life gets back to normal members would return to a fresher looking club space.

The Covid situation presented uncertain trading and restrictions around events,

combine this with the clubs previous two years of trading losses it was very clear that a restructure was required for the club to pull through. I'd like to acknowledge my awesome staff who for the most part could recognise the difficult situation and this obviously was in no part a reflection of the great work they had achieved and we wish them all the very best.

Our modern systems have meant that the club has been able to survive the membership renewal process and bar trading with less resource over winter. The support from volunteers, limited trading hours and help of our caterers has also seen the club trading profitably. For now with a new constitution, new look club and plan

for the future I believe your Club has done the best possible job in these uncertain and tough times.

The Tauranga Sport Fishing Club continues to be an iconic club with outstanding support networks, so make sure you visit enjoy a beer or wine, have a meal, participate, introduce us to your guests, friends and business colleagues as we look to increased our membership and the use of our Club over the coming year.

As a member of the Tauranga Sport Fishing Club you are entitled to enjoy the clubrooms situated at 66 Keith Allen Drive, Sulphur Point Marina Tauranga.

The following information is designed to assist you on future visits to the club.

FACILITIES

The Club has a bar & lounge area with big screen TVs, a pool table, gaming room and designated kids zone with Xbox, Netflix, colouring and toys. We have an outside patio as well as a roof top deck offering magnificent views of Tauranga Harbour and the Mount. Our restaurant 'A Buoy' has a delicious set menu, as well as offering catering, buffet and platters on request to suit your booking. We also have a smaller intimate conference room that is available for hire and offer free wifi throughout the club.

TOURNAMENTS & EVENTS

We hold regular fishing tournaments throughout the year with great prize pools

You have the use of TSFC VHF Tournament Channel 3 & 5 and reciprocal visiting rights to other NZSFC and IGFA Clubs both in NZ and overseas.

club records, pins, points & trophy rules

GENERAL

1. The season opens on 1 July and ends on 30 June.
2. Eligibility: Only full financial members of the Tauranga Sport Fishing Club are eligible for Club Pins, Points, Records and Trophies.
3. Fishing Area: (Inside & outside Chart 54). Only fish caught within the TSFC stated fishing area shall qualify for Club Pins, Points, Records and Trophies. The area is all water encompassed in the Hydrographic Chart NZ54 - Cuvier Island to East Cape. Fish caught outside Chart NZ54 within NZ Territorial waters only qualify for trophies. (2) that relate to outside Chart NZ54.
4. Weigh station: The recognized weigh stations are the Tauranga Sport Fishing Club Clubrooms at Sulphur Point, and all NZSFC affiliated clubs in the Bay of Plenty / Coromandel region.
5. Catch cards: A Tauranga Sport Fishing Club official catch card, correctly completed, must be presented to the weighmaster with the fish or tag and release card.
6. Tackle: Anglers presenting fish at the weigh station are required to have the rod, reel, line/trace, and gaff used for the capture available for inspection by the weighmaster. In the case of record claims, these items must be presented with the fish. The weighmaster will require a line sample for testing.

CLUB PINS

Pins shall be awarded to annual winners for Men's, Women's and Junior's sections in the following categories:

Club Pin Fish (silver pin)

- Snapper (Line weight 15kg and under)
- Other Gamefish Species
 - Heavy Tackle (HT) Line weights 15kg and over (ie 15,24,37 and 60kg)
 - Light Tackle (LT) Line weights 10kg and under (ie 1,2,3,4,6,8 and 10kg)
 - Tag & Release first marlin

Club Record (Gold plate)

NZ Record (silver pin with ruby eye)

World Record (gold pin)

World Record 2nd catch on same day (gold pin with diamond eye)

No angler shall be awarded more than one pin for any species on one day. No angler shall be awarded more than two pins (one for the first and one for the heaviest) fish of the same species in any one season.

7a. SNAPPER Line weights of 15kg and under.

A silver pin shall be awarded to the angler who catches the first qualifying snapper in each line class

i.e. 1, 2, 3, 4, 6, 8, 10 and 15kg line classes.

A Fish weighing heavier by 100 grams also qualifies for a pin. There is a maximum of 2 pins per angler per line class.

To qualify for pins and trophies the fish must have a minimum weigh of 4kg for line classes of 4kg and over or if under 4kg the fish must exceed line weight in each class.

7b. HEAVY TACKLE (HT) Line weights of 15kg and over

A silver pin shall be awarded to the angler who catches the first qualifying fish of each species in each line class i.e. 15, 24, 37 and 60kg line classes.

Each qualifying fish subsequently caught weighing heavier by half a kilogram or more also qualifies for a silver pin.

To qualify for pins and trophies, the fish must equal or exceed the breaking strain of the line and the following minimum weights/length:

Marlin 90kg Broadbill Must exceed line weight

Sharks 90kg Tuna 15 kg Y/T Kingfish 1 meter

The following species, fish must exceed the minimum weight, but do not have to exceed the line weight:

Albacore 7kg S/B Spearfish 10kg

Mahimahi 4kg Wreckfish 10kg

IGFA Braid Top-shot rule applies for pins points and trophies. BRAID line under 15kg used in a capture of a fish must be recorded as 15kg. And every line class above 15kg rounded up one line class from here. IE 15kg recorded as 24kg, 24kg as 37kg and 37kg as 60kg. Braid rated higher than 37kg will not be recognized for Club pins or points.

7c. LIGHT TACKLE (LT) Line weights 10kg and under

A Silver pin shall be awarded to the angler who catches the first qualifying fish of each species in each line class i.e. 1, 2, 3, 4, 6, 8 and 10kg classes.

Each qualifying fish that is subsequently caught weighing heavier by 5 points also qualifies for a silver pin.

The basis for pins and trophies for this section shall be the IGFA points system i.e. the weight of the fish multiplied by 100 and divided by the breaking strain of the line.

To qualify for pins and trophies the fish must equal or exceed the breaking strain of the line except for the following species, which also have minimum weights:

Sharks 30kg Albacore 7kg

S/B Spearfish 10kg Marlin 90kg

Mahimahi 4kg Tuna 10kg

Y/T Kingfish 1 meter Wreckfish 10kg

club records, pins, points & trophy rules

7d. TAG and RELEASE fish

A Silver pin will be awarded to the first angler to tag and release a marlin.

All tag cards and TGFC catch cards must be accompanied by a photograph/video clearly showing the tag in the fish.

A tagged and released fish is recognized by the TSFC as a caught fish i.e. if the first billfish of the season is tagged and released, it will qualify for the first billfish of season trophy. This applies for billfish only.

8. CLUB RECORDS

A Club record shall be awarded to the angler who catches the first qualifying fish of each species in each line class i.e. 1, 2, 3, 4, 6,8,10,15,24,37 and 60kg. Each qualifying fish that is subsequently caught weighing heavier by 500 grams also qualifies for and replaces the current Club record.

To qualify for Club records the fish must be caught in accordance with IGFA international angling rules. Only monofilament can claim Club records or adhering to the IGFA Top-shot rule.

The minimum accepted weight for any Club record catch claim is 0.453kg (1lb).

A list of all current Club record holders is held on the Club's records board in the clubrooms and published on the Club's website.

9. POINTS (Angler and Boat)

Points shall be awarded to individual anglers and boats for all qualifying fish weighed and tagged & released. Points will accumulate towards annual individual angler and boat totals.

Points shall be awarded for qualifying fish weighed based on the IGFA points system i.e. the weight of the fish multiplied by 100 and divided by the breaking strain of the line.

The following points shall be awarded for fish tagged and released:

Billfish 400 point	Shortbilled Spearfish 150 points
Shark 100 points	Tuna (Yellowfin, Big Eye, Bluefin) 150 points
Mahi Mahi 50 points	Y/T Kingfish 50 points (over 1 meter)

Points shall also be awarded to individual boat totals for qualifying fish weighed and tagged and released by Day members.

10. TROPHIES

A list of trophies with condition and winner shall be published annually in the Club's yearbook together with a list of trophies not awarded and their conditions.

If a species of fish for a Club trophy is not caught within Chart 54, that trophy may be awarded to a fish caught within NZ Territorial waters.

rules for sponsored fishing tournaments

Headquarters

Headquarters for each contest will be the Sulphur Point Clubrooms. Tournament communications will be through VHF Channel 3 or Coastguard VHF Channel 66.

Eligibility

All anglers must be current financial members of the Tauranga Sport Fishing Club or other NZSFC member club, or have a paid current Day Anglers Fishing Card. All fish are eligible provided they are species nominated for the contest, exceed the minimum weight and were caught on line not exceeding 60kg test, or line specified for a particular contest.

Fishing Area

All water encompassed in Hydrographic Modified Chart number NZ54 - Cuvier Island to East Cape. Line north of Lottin Point northwards as per Sponsors Grid Chart.

Entries

Entry forms accompanied by contest fees must be received by the TSFC Office, Sulphur Point by the time specified on the entry form. Entries will be accepted by direct debit or on our website at www.tsfc.co.nz up until the day prior to the event. After this time, entries will only be accepted at the Club. Contest starting dates and times will be detailed on the entry form for each contest.

Teams

Anglers may fish tournaments as individuals including fishing from PWCs and kayaks as long as they have communications with Coastguard Channel 01 or a support vessel. Anglers may transfer from boat to boat during the contest, but fish or points are not transferable and remain with the nominated boat. Contest headquarters must be notified immediately in writing of any angler transfers.

Cancellation of contest

There will be, in the main, no cancellation of a contest. If, due to the extenuating circumstances or severe weather conditions, the contest is cancelled or postponed, notification of such cancellations will be before start fishing on any given day of the contest.

Refunds

If a full cancellation occurs and no further date is set for the contest, the Administrator shall, upon written application from the team captain, refund the contest fees. Full refunds will be given for any reason prior to the tournament provided it is requested 24 hours before briefing.

Briefing

Briefing is compulsory and the team captain or nominated team member fishing the tournament must register at briefing night and attend and remain until the conclusion of briefing unless prior approval to not attend has been given by the Tournament Convenor.

Stop Fishing

Stop Fishing shall be the end of the contest. All catch cards must be in the weighmasters hands by final weigh in time on the last day of the tournament. Fish caught after weigh in time on all days except the last day of the tournament will go into the next days catch.

Weighstation

The weighstation for all contests will be the TSFC Contest Headquarters at Sulphur Point. All fish must be weighed from the boat on which they were caught.

Condition of Capture

All fish to be presented to the weighstation fresh or chilled but not frozen.

Catch Cards Normal TSFC Catch Cards will be used and must be completed by the time of the weigh in.

Minimum Fish Weights

The minimum weights for fish in all sponsored tournaments unless otherwise stated on the tournament entry form are:

Billfish 90kg	Tuna 15kg
Albacore 7kg	Skipjack 5kg
Mahimahi 4kg	Kingfish 1 meter
S/B Spearfish 10kg	Snapper 2kg
Broadbill must exceed line weight	

Line Breaking Strain

The maximum line breaking strain used shall be 60kg.

Braid: Braid may be used in tournaments. If the events are line class events, then the top-shot rule applies.

Disputes

The TSFC Committee will appoint judges to investigate disputes. Such disputes must be received by contest headquarters in writing within three hours of the contest closing time. The decision of the judges will be final.

Weighmasters

Any authorized weighmaster may weigh fish.

General

The above Rules of the Tauranga Sport Fishing Club Inc. take precedence over Club Rules for Pins and Trophies and IGFA Rules during sponsored contests only. However, IGFA Rules will cover any matters not covered by these rules. All fish caught during a sponsored contest by current financial members of the TSFC are eligible for Club Records, Pins and Trophies providing the fish has been caught in accordance with the TSFC Rules for Pins and Trophies. This does not apply for Day anglers. Points will be awarded to boats for fish caught by Day Anglers. This applies to the following trophies only: Most Billfish points from a private launch – “Lady Luck Trophy” and Most Billfish points from a commercial launch – “De Luxa Trophy”.

Rule changes may be implemented prior to the start of the event for any reason and will be communicated clearly at briefing.

LONGEST KINGFISH & SNAPPER MEASURE AND RELEASE CATEGORIES

The fish must swim away and be returned in good condition for an entry to be eligible.

LENGTH PHOTO REQUIREMENTS;

A. MEASURING REQUIREMENTS

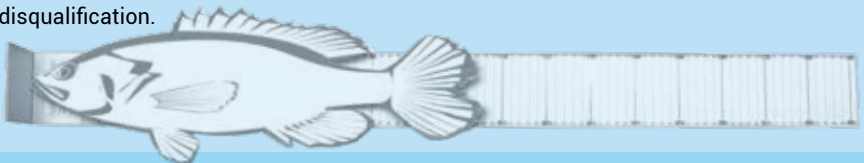
1. Fish must be measured using a IGFA, NZ Fishing Competition, Decoro or Top Catch measure board. Measure boards should be used on a flat surface. No other measures accepted unless checked with Tournament Convener.
2. The fish's snout must be touching the nose stop with the mouth closed and free of lures or lifting devices.
3. With the fish lying on top of the measuring device, measurements will be taken from the most forward part of the fish's snout with the mouth closed to the rear centre edge of the tail.
4. All measurements will be made in 0.5 centimetres increments.
5. Fish that measure between increments shall be recorded at the lower of the two increments. For example, a fish that measures between 45 and 45.5 centimetres will have a recorded length of 45 centimetres. This is determined by the last line that falls inside of the fork in the tail. A fork length "on the line" will mean again the lower of the two increments.

B. PHOTOGRAPHIC REQUIREMENTS

All measured and released fish require photographic evidence clearly showing the fish on a TSFC approved measure board. Photographs included with applications must contain the following information.

1. The full length of the fish on the measuring device clearly showing the position of the mouth and tail. The fish may be held in position, but must be done in a manner that does not obscure the view of the fish on the tape.
2. A close up showing the position of the fish's nose and tail on the measuring device.
3. Every fish must have the angler number included in the picture (placed on the fish) Angler numbers are issued at registration and will be your Angler Number.
4. If in doubt take extra photographs, or even GoPro footage to authenticate.
5. All photographs must be digital and recorded on SD or CF cards or be able to be emailed from cell phones so that resolution is clear (when zoomed in) Please bring in USB lead to the camera for any other format. Photos can be emailed to office@tsfc.co.nz or roly@tsfc.co.nz and must be high enough resolution to clearly see measure.
6. All entries must be submitted on a TSFC catch card and presented to the weigh station. Angler complete with catch card, measure board and photographic proof must be at the weigh station by final weigh in time.

Any doubt as to the authenticity or accuracy of the measured fish will result in disqualification.



tournament convenors report

This past season was cut brutally short with the announcement and the restrictions that were introduced with the arrival of Covid 19. We do however, need to be thankful for the fishing we did get in and it was nice to once again see the small to medium yellowfin tuna back which always give the season a positive start. The schedule went to a measure format this year where anglers have the choice to either keep or release. It was great once again to have Scott and Mig from Fishing & Adventure supporting the event and again catching quality fish!

The Calcutta was back again in The All About Construction Game On tournament back in January with 126 anglers competing for a purse of over \$8,000. 2019 DECORO SNAPPER KINGFISH TOURNAMENT REPORT

The Snapper Kingfish comp for some reason always feels like the first tournament for the year. Spring is in the air, the days are getting warmer and longer and the kingies are starting to bust up bait on the surface, plus there always seem to be a few really big snapper around.

The team at Decoro this year emphasised a real desire to run an event that was fun and had as little impact on the resource as possible. To achieve this we revisited the tournament prizes schedule and basically redistributed the value into those Measure and Release categories. Not only this we expanded the M&R sections ensuring that everyone who came in the top five for both snapper and kingfish walked away with a nice Penn combo as well as a bunch of tackle and merchandise. Still having weigh prizes ensures that anglers can still keep fish if they wish and gave anglers flexibility with fish that didn't survive capture could also be submitted. They just aren't worth as much at prize giving time. It's a formula that really does work. The fact we had 123 anglers turn up last weekend to essentially release many of their best fish speaks



volumes as to how seriously our anglers value the resource we have!

The weather again this year was a pretty tough call with some conflicting forecasting and the potential for wind on the last day of the event. After waiting for the final updates as a group we decided that the weather window looked like we could comfortably get the comp underway but with the wind due sometime after lunch on Sunday we pulled the weigh station hours forward with final weigh time at 4pm.

There was only one crew through the weigh station on Saturday and that was the team off Marlin with young Ashton Edwards weighing a beautiful 5.8kg Snapper, this one later claiming third place in the weigh snapper category and heaviest fish for a

junior. Well done Ashton!

Day two turned on the calm weather and with that the boat ramp carparks looked absolutely chocka! The majority of reports seemed to be suggesting slow fishing out there, however there were rumours abound of some very large snapper being caught so this predictably made the weigh in all the more exciting.

Only one kingfish made the length for a legal weigh at 1m long, and it was Mark Armistead claiming first place in this section with a 15.8kg kingy. Other than this all other kingfish were submitted in the M&R category, 22 in total and some nice one too with Stu Roberts fishing on Nailed it picking up the best of them at 114cm (Smart Marine grid) and also winning the Dave Foley Memorial Trophy for the longest Kingfish. The longest fish for a junior was claimed this year by Mason De Raat with a respectable 87cm kingfish.

In the Snapper weigh section Tony Brown managed to pip the competition with a 6.36kg fish and Jamie Lee just behind with a 5.84kg. In total only 12 snapper weighed this

year compared to 27 fish submitted in the M&R category.

This year it was heart-warming to see so many large snapper being caught and returned to the water to fight another day. The top four in the Snapper M&R section were over 70cm, the biggest of these a whooping 85cm beast (est 12kg) caught by David Wallace fishing on board Free Flo, this one out of the Generation Homes sponsors grid!

The final accolades were shared by the team on board In Pursuit winning the Decoro Team Trophy. This one was for the longest combined length of a Kingfish and Snapper. It was close with the In Pursuit team clocking up 175.5cm, Free Flo 174cm and Nailed It on 172cm! Well done to all of you!

Finally thanks to all of our anglers that turned out and supported the event and in turn supported the Club and Sponsors - Decoro, Rock Gas Tauranga, Penn Tackle and Heartland Homes! This is one very cool event, made all the better for the people involved and supporting it!

We can't wait for next year!

STONEY CREEK ONE BASE 2020 REPORT

After what felt like months of dry weather, we woke on the morning of the 31st One Base to some substantial rain that luckily decided to clear on day break. The smell of wet ground and fresh coffee at 6am in front of the Club was a nice combo and set the scene as anglers started to arrive, some a little blurry eyed after what had been a fun briefing evening the night before. With gear checked, tanks full and the excitement of four days of fishing ahead it's easy to see why the One Base is such an anticipated and exciting event to fish. 120 teams, 424 anglers and hundreds of miles of ocean to fish, it was time.

The new changes to the random access rule meant two starting points with the trailer boats checking into the club ready for a start from the carpark, and the rest of the team's starting as usual from the entrance. The start time this year was pulled back to 7am to avoid a very large cruise ship due through the entrance at 7.30am, and of course the teams were happy to get another half hour of fishing in for the day. Conditions were near perfect for the start with around 40 teams starting on time with a handful choosing to open the throttles and burn plenty of that GOFUEL right from the get go!

With an approaching front due late in the day, our

tournament communication had strongly suggested all boats were off the water by 7pm if west of White Island, as it looked like this Sou' East shift would strongly influence also the coming days with many boats making plans around the expected winds. The clear choice here was the East Cape area that would provide the only substantial cover for boaties in a SE wind. Often the wind shadow of the Cape extended well out into the BOP so it was clear many launches and trailer boats would head this way.

So not long into Day One in fact at 10.54am an excited call came into TGA Game Base, Jason Eynon on board Sun Dance Kid was hooked up in grid 32 LEGASEA, and it was only an hour later it transpired a magical Blue Marlin was landed. With throttles down the fish was weighed at 2.30pm and pulled the scales down to 256.1kg and clearly setting an enormous challenge for every other boat out there!

The lads on A Salt Weapon also had a great day tagging two stripey's in the Smart Marine grid obviously finding a great piece of water. The Kaimanawa team landed a lovely mahi, and although the weigh station was relatively quiet it didn't truly reflect the day's activity well, with 7 tagged marlin for the day, and 33 called hook ups! This really did feel like the big bite before the storm!

The wind arrived on Wednesday evening right on

cue, and really didn't settle well enough for Thursday so Tournament Op's had no choice but to make a weather call at 6am. So the call was to cancel blue water species for the day, but allowing teams to fish an inshore schedule, namely snapper and kingies (both measure and weigh sections) and also squid were permitted to be fish for. Clearly the hope here is teams would not push the conditions and keep themselves safe for the day. The weigh station still was busy weighing fish from the previous day. Highlights included Ocean Warriors Kingfish at 25.4kg to angler Geoffrey Layne and a Yellowfin Tuna of 15kg the first for the event. Tagged marlin came from Black Label and Out of the Blue while we had six mahi mahi across the scales, three of these from Satisfaction 2. A blue marlin off Ocean Pacific to angler Kim Curtis pulled the scales to 187.3kg and now placed solidly in the Billfish category in 2nd place.

Day Three and the weather showed little improvement but with 20 knots being the limit and an easing forecast in the Recreational forecast, this was just enough to allow boats to fish. However warnings were given to those fishing west of White Island as conditions were far from ideal so it was

Skippers Discretion! The call proved to be the right one for those fishing in the east, a number of hook ups 40 plus for the day keeping Deryk flat out on the radio. Just a quick thankyou to Deryk, Steven Treloar and Mark Armistead for their assistance on the VHF, a job very well done! The weigh station for day three was a quiet affair with a number of boats not making the 6.30pm cut off, so all these catches would fall into day four. The highlights for day three included a lovely blue marlin to Gulf Seeker, angler Jonathan Flude, this fish weighing 177.2kg and placing 3rd in the Billfish. Brett Waterhouse claimed the heaviest kingfish for the day at 20.1kg off Okura 2 caught from FMT Investments.

Saturday - Day Four and the weather had eased slightly but was far from good and the boats down



east were all on their way home some empty handed and others with potentially competition winning fish. We had Solace, Brothers In Arms and Ocean Pacific potentially had marlin to challenge the Sundance Kid's fish, as well as a very large broadbill swordfish taken by Black Label at Mayor on Friday. Strictly Fishing had weighed a stunning Blue Marlin the previous night of 193.9kg, and there was an awesome Yellowfin Tuna of 58.8kg to Kevin Houlton off Distraction. It was setting up to be a nail bitter of a finish!

With a 3pm cut off the weigh station, things were pumping with 43 fish processed. 8 tagged marlin, Black Labels Broadbill caught by Chris Tzazyk weigh in at 211.8kg and it was Ocean Pacific's next Blue Marlin to go the closest at 215.8kg to Mark Hanna, the combined fish ultimately giving Ocean Pacific the Champion Team Trophy for 2020. There were more yellowfin tuna, three to the Riba Team out of Generation Homes and one for Ocean Monarch all these fish in the 20kg range. Brothers in Arms Blue marlin went 165.6kg and with this sealing the win for the Sundance Kid fish taken on Day One much to the relief of Jason Eynon!

It was a wonderful event this year with plenty of fish, the weather could have been kinder but the spirit of the event is undeniable and given the smiles on prize giving night it really did look like most had a really great time.

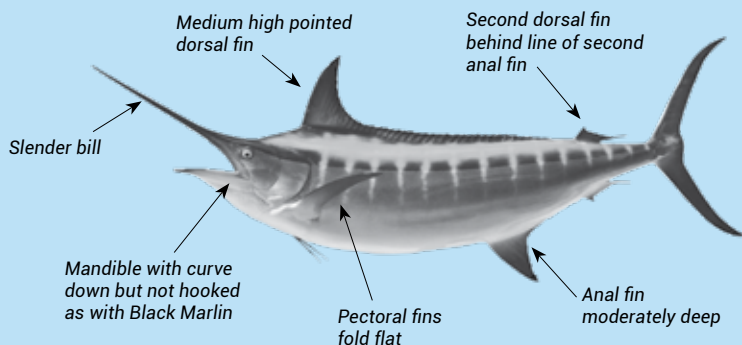
BLACK MARLIN

Heavy round bill; down-curved heavy mandible (lower jaw); low rounded dorsal less than half body depth; pectoral fins curved with aerofoil in section-fixed (immovable) in Black Marlin more than 55kg (120lb); second dorsal in front of start of second anal fin; anal fin depth about equal to height of dorsal; tail semicircular; single lateral line visible in most weights, particularly juveniles and jumbo size marlin.



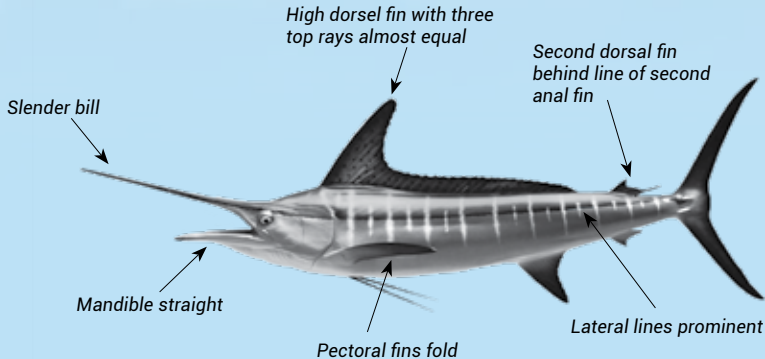
BLUE MARLIN

Moderately heavy round bill; slightly curved mandible (lower jaw); medium high dorsal; pointed dorsal about three quarters of body depth; pectoral fins tapered and flat; second dorsal behind line of start of second anal fin; anal fin medium depth; tail strongly semi-circular; lateral line not visible in adults. Atlantic Blue Marlin has as many as three or more chain links. Pacific Blue Marlin has single chain link and partially single lateral line.



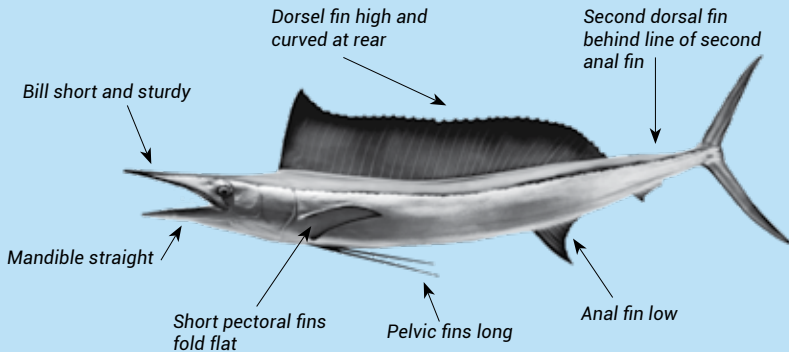
STRIPED MARLIN

Slender round bill; long straight mandible (lower jaw); high dorsal-first three high rays almost equal height; dorsal about equal to body depth-not so obvious when larger than 120kg; pectoral fins tapered and flat; second dorsal behind start of second anal fin (anal fin deep); tail slightly veed, cut away at tips of both lobes of tail; flesh above eyes shows eye when skin is removed; single lateral line clearly visible. Flesh of most marlin is white, grey or pinkish. Flesh of striped marlin is sometimes light but often orange. Even if body flesh is light in colour, a section above the eye will show orange when skin section is removed.



SHORTBILL SPEARFISH

Very short round bill - not much longer than straight mandible (lower jaw); dorsal long and high, highest at front, rounded at tail; short pectoral; anus separated from anal fin bt approx length of depth of anal fin; tail veed.
